How Dan. 9:24-27 is Explained in Dan. 10-12

<u>Dan. 10-12</u> is <u>all one vision</u>, and it builds on, expands, and explains in more detail what was given in Dan. 9:24-27 (the prophetic principle of "repeat and enlarge" that works all the way through the book from the beginning in Daniel 2).

<u>Dan. 9:24-27</u> is basically about two points... actually, <u>two "desolations"</u>

- **1.)** The <u>"daily" desolation</u>, or opposition, by the ancient <u>pagan</u> empires of world history, especially <u>pagan</u> <u>Rome</u>, including the final 70 weeks (490 years) of Jewish probation (457BC 34AD), and their rejection of the Messiah (which closed probation for the "chosen" Jewish people as the world's teachers).
- **2.)** The "desolation of abomination" of Papal Rome (until the "consummation" at Jesus' return).

The two Romes are the two "desolations" (9:26) that oppress God's people through "The 2520 or 7 Times."

<u>Dan. 11:1-13</u> explains <u>point #1</u> by giving the ongoing history of <u>paganism</u> (the first, or <u>"daily"</u> desolation, that began in 723 BC) starting with the Greeks in 331 BC and leading down to the formation of <u>pagan Rome</u> (as the King of the North) at about 200 BC (including the rest of the 70 weeks of Jewish probation, ending when they rejected Jesus their "prince of the covenant" by giving Him to <u>pagan Rome</u> in v. 14.) <u>Both Romes</u> are the "robbers of thy people" in v.14 who "establish the [whole] vision" of Chs. 10-12.

<u>Dan. 11:14-30</u> explains the history of the "daily" desolation of <u>paganism</u> in <u>pagan Rome</u> (including the crucifixion of Christ in v.22) up to the decree of Justinian in 533 AD, which made the Pope, <u>papal</u> Rome, the new "king" of Europe (the new King of the North), or the "abomination of desolation."

<u>Dan. 11:30-39</u> explains <u>point #2</u> by giving the past history of the second "desolation" (the "abomination of desolation") or the <u>first</u> of the <u>two phases</u> of Papal Rome (the <u>wounded</u> and <u>healed</u> heads of Rev. 13).

<u>Dan. 11:40-45</u> covers from 1798AD onward, giving prophecy about what "healed" <u>Modern Rome</u> is in the process of doing right now, until human probation closes in Dan. 12:1(see <u>Modern Babylon in Three Parts</u>).

<u>Dan. 12</u> is primarily about what happened during the 1260 years of <u>papal</u> Rome's rule, the "abomination of desolation" (from 538AD to 1798AD), ending at the end of the 1260 and 1290 years...(and also the end of the <u>first</u> 2520 years). And Dan. 12 is <u>also</u> about the "<u>blessing</u>" at the end of the 1335 years in 1843 (at the "Midnight Cry" of the Millerites) which led up to the <u>end</u> of the <u>second</u> 2520 days of "scattering" on Oct. 22, 1844, <u>and the beginning of the time of "gathering</u>" that E.G. White described in <u>Early Writings</u>, <u>p.74</u>.

The <u>Seventh-day Adventist Church</u> was called into being <u>at that time</u> (the beginning of the world-wide "gathering time") to <u>warn</u> and "<u>gather</u>" all God's children into one world-wide family, <u>just before</u> Satan's <u>final attack</u> (through his "healed" <u>Modern Rome</u>) with his <u>Sunday Law</u> and Death Decree. <u>Those who heed the warnings</u> given about the shortness of time (based on these prophecies in Daniel, and in the Revelation), and spiritually <u>prepare</u> themselves to <u>resist</u> the <u>Pope's Sunday Law</u> and Death Decree, will be saved.

Final note about the two "desolations".....

Daniel prayed about them in <u>Dan. 9:11...."the curse of Moses</u>" (see Lev. Chs. 28-26) that had come upon the followers of God, both Jew and Christian. The <u>pagan part</u> of the curse lasted 1260 years (from 723 BC to 538 AD), and the <u>papal part</u> of the curse was <u>another</u> 1260 years (from 538 AD to 1798 AD), making a total of 2520 years of oppression of God's people.
